#### SONGS OF THE SERVANT, PART 1 Isaiah 42:1-9

As we enter into the Advent season, celebrating our Lord's birth, we will take time to consider the four great Songs of the Servant, as found in the book of Isaiah. The *Servant of the Lord* is the governing theme from Isaiah 40 through Chapter 53. At times, the servant pertains to the nation of Israel, and at other times the context points to the individual known as the Messiah.

There are two stanzas to be distinguished in 42:1-9. The first stanza (1-4) contains three *justice* statements, and pertain to the universal promise of *justice* to the nations (see verses 1, 3, and 4). Here, *justice* pertains to God's revealed truth (or religion), and the global missions implications. The second stanza (5-9) stresses *the LORD* (see verses 5, 6, and 8), referring to God's covenantal relationship to us. Let's explore these two stanzas, and learn how these promises point toward our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
