Dr. Gary Hylander Acts Series

THE PEOPLE OF PROMISE

Acts 15:12-21

When Paul and Barnabas arrived at Jerusalem to give an account of God's saving grace among the Gentiles, the legalists made a two-fold argument, challenging the words of Paul and Barnabas. First, they argued that Gentiles could not be part of the true believing fellow-ship until they were circumcised "according to the custom of Moses". Second, they argued that Gentiles professing faith in Christ would be required to keep the Mosaic law.

Peter stood up to refute the legalists with an argument from personal experience. With the story of Cornelius, a Gentile who was saved by grace through faith still fresh in Peter's mind, Peter stated "But we believe that we will be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, just as they will" (15:11). With these words, the assembly fell silent. After Paul and Barnabas recounted their experiences, James, the leader of the church in Jerusalem spoke, shifting the argument from personal experiences to the biblical promise, that salvation of Gentiles had always been included in God's plan, as revealed in the promise found in Amos 9:11,12.
