Plan to bring a lawn chair or blanket and some sunscreen! Remember to bring a snack, an hors d'oeuvre, or dessert to share after the service. Cold water, lemonade, and paper products will be provided.

You'll be encouraged as you hear testimonies of God at work in the lives of those being baptized. A sneak peak at one such testimony comes from Andrea M.

Andrea says that her "metamorphosis took years," explaining that her knowledge in her younger years of what Jesus did for her did not have an impact on her heart until more recently. "I went on for years doing what I wanted and believed I would go to heaven when I died," Andrea says. A serious motorcycle accident just over 5 years ago nearly took her life. Still, Andrea admits, this did not change the way she was living. "I was the seed that was continually choked out by the weeds...I would hear the gospel, but the desires of the world were more appeasing." Then, over the past few years, the Holy Spirit has been working on Andrea's heart. She says she started reading her Bible and "everything started to shift" just like it says in 2 Corinthians 5:17: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, He is a new creation, the old has passed away, behold, all things have become new." Andrea says, "Everything about me transformed, the music I listened to, my thoughts, my words, my actions, the things I watched, the people I surrounded myself with, and most importantly my desires. All I desire now is my Lord, I yearn to see Him, I seek to know and study Him more. Today, I am undeniably certain, that if I died today, I would see my Lord and Savior."

Awana 2019 Is Just Around The Corner!

It's time to get ready for another awesome year of Awana! Awana is a place where lives are changed and children are reached with the transformative message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and it all begins in just a few short weeks! Each night of club will be filled with irresistible excitement, divided into three segments:



- Age appropriate, energetic games
- Small group interaction and Bible-based lessons
- Bible teaching, worship, and the Gospel message

Cubbies provides foundational teaching for preschoolers, ages 3 (by September 1 and potty-trained) and 4. Games, puppets, crafts, awards, and other activities create a lively weekly experience where fun and learning go hand-in-hand.

Sparks offers fun with God's Word for grades 5K-2. It's filled with games, music, teaching, and Bible memory verses.

Truth and Training (T&T) leads students grades 3-6 through a deeper dive into the Bible. T&T engages kids by answering their questions about God and the Bible, while we study the meaning of God's grace.

Registration forms will be mailed the first week of August to last year's clubbers. Forms should be returned to the church office by August 31. Registration will be held in the Welcome Center prior to 2nd and 3rd services beginning in mid-August until the start of club. Registration will also be available online at www.e-free-family.com or in the church office on weekdays. Online registrants will need to see the Awana Secretary, Marti Willis, to sign a medical release.

Parents are encouraged to pre-pay the cost for the program prior to the first night. Dues are \$0.50 a night (or \$8 for half a year, \$16 per year), and handbooks are \$12 each. Uniforms are highly encouraged and are priced as follows:

- Cubbies blue vest (M, L, XL, XXL) \$14
- Sparks red vest (M, L, XL, XXL, XXXL) \$15
- T&T Ultimate Adventure uniform (Youth 12, 14 or Adult S, M) \$18
- T&T Ultimate Challenge uniform (Youth M, L or Adult S, M, L, XL) \$18

K-6 clubbers whose pre-registration is received by 8/31/19 will receive an Awana share; clubbers whose payments are received by 8/31/19 will receive five Awana shares.

How Did We Finish FY2019?

Fiscal Year 2019 (July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019) ended with a deficit (our first in many years) of \$18,696. Giving for the year totaled \$1,094,863, significantly below the budgeted plan of \$1,200,000 and less than 1% ahead of the previous year. Expenses were \$1,113,559, far better than the budget of \$1,200,000, and only 3% more than the previous year.

"Given the economic prosperity we are experiencing in our nation, state and region, our giving was disappointing, but outstanding expense control helped minimize the impact," said Larry W, Treasurer. "We are praying



that everyone will step up their giving as we begin a new fiscal year with a budget increase of just over 4%, approved by the congregation at the Body Life Update."
