Our 69<sup>th</sup> annual Missions Conference is just around the corner, and we are excited to have Dr. Craig Ott as our keynote speaker. Dr. Ott, on faculty at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School (TEDS) since 2002, has many years of practical and academic experience in missions work. He spent 21 years in Germany with ReachGlobal (formerly EFCA International Mission) and has planted churches in Munich, Ingolstadt, Neumarkt and Markt Indersdorf, Germany as well as in Schaumburg, IL.

From 1995 to 2002, Dr. Ott served as Central Europe Church sultant for ReachGlobal and, from 1998 to 2002, he taught at the Akademie für Weltmission in Korntal, Germany, where he continues to teach regularly as an adjunct professor. He has taught or consulted national and mission leaders in forty different countries.



Dr. Ott currently occupies the ReachGlobal Chair of Mission, which was established to link the mission agency and seminary, integrating mission theory and practice. He is also a prolific author. Three of his books were voted by *International* 

Bulletin of Mission Research as among the top ten or fifteen most significant mission books in their publication year. Two of his articles are among the top ten most read articles in the journal *Missiology*.

Dr. Ott and his wife Alice, also on faculty at TEDS, live in Buffalo Grove, Illinois, and have three grown sons. His hobbies include bicycling, film, and guitar.

### Sign Up & Buy Tickets Now!

Tickets for the Friday night Missions supper are on sale Sunday mornings between services. With the conference desert theme in mind, the food will be Turkish. On the menu are Crispy Cheese and Herb Filled Filo Pastry Rolls, Turkish Red Lentil and Bulgur Soup, Baked Turkish Meatballs, and more, plus Baklava for dessert! Ticket prices remain \$5 each or a family total of \$20. Seating is limited to approximately 200, so buy your tickets early!

### FCN Blood Pressure Screening

*Create in me a pure heart, O God* (Psalm 51:10). As ambassadors of Christ, we have a responsibility to be mindful of both the spiritual and physical condition of our heart. Our Faith Community Nursing ministry encourages our congregation to take a proactive, God -honoring approach to caring for our God-given bodies. Sponsoring the annual blood pressure screening is one way FCN would like to help!

Coinciding with February being American Heart Month, the free blood pressure screening will take place on Sunday, February 11 in room 109 after 1st and 2nd services. No signup is required! Please wear a short-sleeved or thin long-sleeved shirt for an accurate reading. Your blood pressure will be recorded on a wallet-sized card for your taking. Also, you'll have a chance to meet the newest members of the FCN ministry!



If you are unable to attend the screening on February 11, call the church office (452.6520) to make an appointment with a Faith Community Nurse to have your blood pressure taken.

- 1 of every 3 adults has high blood pressure (29% of American adults).
- Only about half of people with high blood pressure have their condition under control.
- High blood pressure costs the nation \$46 billion each year! (This includes the cost of health care services, medications to treat the high blood pressure, and missed days of work.)

### Who, What, & Why is FinCom?

Established in October 2005, the standing Finance Committee (aka FinCom) was organized to assure the church, as an organization, would continue to be financially viable. They do this by putting appropriate financial policies in place, overseeing the budget process (from forecast to reality), and by advising both the Elder and Deacon Boards on assimilating financial planning into vision.

Members of the Finance Committee must be committed to the tithe as a minimum standard of giving to the local church, be official church members, have experience with business finance, be able to relate sound business policies to a non-profit ministry environment, and be able to yield to the higher standard of Biblical values. FinCom is comprised of six members who have various roles:

- Treasurer (Larry W.), FinCom chairman, who oversees all financial reports and represents the Finance Committee's recommendations at monthly Deacon meetings
- Assistant Treasurer (Shawn U.), who oversees the Capital Improvements budget and timetable
- Deacon Chairman (Dean B.), liaison between the Deacon Board who oversees the budget, and the Finance Committee who prepares/ recommends the annual budget
- Member-at-large (David G.), who has personal and corporate understanding of budgeting
- Administrator (Heather Tempas), who oversees the budget from the staff perspective and also serves as FinCom Secretary
- Pastor (Jon MacDonald), who provides visionary leadership and liaises with the Elder Board

The Bookkeeper (Ann Tuneberg), though not a member, also attends and provides valuable hands-on insight through financial reports and research.

At its monthly meetings, the committee reviews the prior month's Income & Expenses Reports for planned and unplanned variances in giving and expenses, updates the Capital Improvements projects for timing/costs as planned, discusses current trends that may impact the church's financial future, and accepts/manages budget requests from the Deacon Board. One of the committee's biggest tasks is to develop the annual budget with input from the church staff.
