Throughout the months, various orders, mandates, and suggestions have aimed to help us stop the spread . . . we've even had to teach our children that, for the time being, sharing is no longer caring!

So here we are, entering the fall and winter seasons which, as Wisconsinites, we know means inevitably more inside rather than outside activities.
