We'll begin with a free-of-charge picnic supper, followed by music from our clubbers, a PowerPoint slideshow reflecting on the year's activities, and various small group displays.

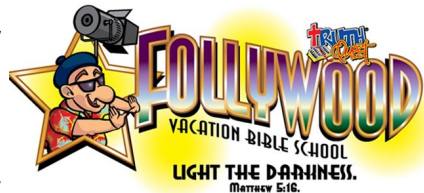

## Hospice: A Family Conversation

Attention adults, regardless of age! If you are a caregiver to a loved one with life-limiting illnesses, a conversation about hospice can help you and your loved one prepare for end-of-life situations as well as help you support that person's wishes. Luann Travis, Community Engagement Coordinator from Sharon S. Richardson Community Hospice, will discuss Hospice Services and Caregiver Needs at the next Forever Faithful program. Our very own Faith Community Nursing Coordinator, Kristie Ahlborg, will also join Luann. Of the 7 years Kristie worked in hospice care, 4 of those years were at SSRCH, where she cared for both patients in various stages of the dying process and their families. This care included physical, emotional, psychosocial, and spiritual care.

Join us for delicious food and an opportunity to learn about hospice services, the need for caregivers to participate in the conversation, and signs of caregiver fatigue.
